Wilcox Medical Center is administering the Pfizer vaccine for ages 12 and older and the Moderna vaccine for ages 18 and older.

Third doses of the Pfizer and Moderna mRNA COVID-19 vaccines for immunocompromised individuals are available by appointment only **28 days** after the last dose.

Pfizer boosters are available for people ages 12 and older **5 calendar months** or longer after the last dose. Moderna boosters are available for people ages 18 and older **6 calendar months** or longer after the last dose.

Wilcox Medical Center and Kaua'i Medical Clinic will no longer provide the Johnson & Johnson vaccine at its vaccination sites or clinic locations.

GUIDELINES FOR THIRD DOSES AND BOOSTER SHOTS

- Third doses of the Pfizer vaccine are available for immunocompromised people ages 12 and older 28 days or longer after the last Pfizer dose.
- Third doses of the Moderna vaccine are available for immunocompromised people ages 18 and older 28 days or longer after the last Moderna dose.
- For immunocompromised individuals who are scheduling their third dose, the same mRNA vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) should be used.
- Pfizer boosters are available for people ages 12 and older 5 calendar months or longer after the last dose. Moderna boosters are available for people ages 18 and older 5 calendar months or longer after the last dose.

Appointments are required for all third doses. Walk-ins will be taken for first and second doses only. Vaccine recipients must be at least 12 years old. Those under the age of 18 need to be accompanied by a parent or guardian, who will need to sign a consent form. Please bring a photo ID and an insurance card, if you have one.
