Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) Update Course

Course Description

The goal of the PALS course is to aid the pediatric health care provider in developing the knowledge and skills necessary to efficiently and effectively manage critically ill infants and children, resulting in improved outcomes.

Intended Audience

Registered nurses, nurse practitioners, pediatricians, emergency physicians, family physicians, physician assistants, paramedics, respiratory therapists, and other health care providers who initiate and direct advanced life support in pediatric emergencies.

Course Pre-requisites

- Current AHA PALS Provider card.
- Precourse Self-Assessment test with a score of 70% or higher (registrants must bring a printout of the test to class; *no admittance without the precourse self-assessment test with a passing score*).
